This is a 65 year old patient presented to the surgical outpatient clinic complaining of steadily progressive dysphagia for the last two weeks according to the patient!. He is still tolerating fluids easily but lost about 5 kg of his body weight. There is no bouts of coughing or florid aspiration pneumonia.

There no clear History of Dietary or other Predisposing Factors

There is no History of cranial insults or bulbar palsy of cranial nerve to affect swallowing. Other causes of transfer dysphagia are not there.

*He in not Hypertensive nor diabetic and not on any medications.

*His Past History is irrelevant; No Surgeries and No other related medical insults

*Barium Swallow: typical of carcinoma lower oesophagus

*UGIE: Tumour lower oesophagus . Biopsy: Adencarcinoma (intestinal type)
